1974 Season Review

National League

Hanging from the yard arm was the usual fate for pirates of old and Gisborne City administrators could not be blamed for wishing something similar for modern day pirates who annually plunder the club of its best players. In 1974 the losses were heavier than usual; Alan Vest, Ken Morton and Malcolm Knox went to New Brighton, Maurice Tillotson, George Flecknor and later Ken Dugdale to Stop Out, Eddie Simpson to the Central League Club Leopard United as player-coach. To fill some of the vacancies City brought out three players from England; Ray Veall who had played 1st division football for Everton in the early Sixties, Keith Bowley and Garry Jenkins, both of whom had been in Southend United's second team with City's coach Kevin Fallon, Veall proved to be the best importation City has since Ken Armstrong. He had the ability to read the game, control the ball, put his passes where he wanted them and by positive running off the ball, assisted his team mates out numerous awkward situations. At first, he was visibly upset at this colleague's inability to read play in the same manner but realizing their limitations he adapted his own game with better results for all concerned.

With Fallon in charge Gisborne tended to play a defence orientated game but when he fell out with club management and Veall was given command the emphasis switched to attack and while this was not the reason for Gisborne's improved showing over the second round it at least provided a more satisfying spectacle for the fans who stood loyally behind their team even when results were no the best.

The team Gisborne fielded in the National League was a somewhat makeshift arrangement but was the best available in the circumstances and as the season progressed players such as John Fyfe, Jim Nicholls and the youngsters Stephen Grout, Terry Parkin and Keith Mackay started to guild a reputation. Keith Bowley's splendid goalkeeping, Les Todd's fierce determination and Garry Jenkins' sharp shooting helped Gisborne avoid the promotion-relegation series while Bill Struthers, who arrived mid-season, showed touches of class in between his comic acts. Playing in midfield created problems for John Warrington who is basically a one footed player and he looked more at home back on the left wing where he shifted when Struthers arrived. Len Cudd's three goals brought him level with Danny Birnie as Gisborne's most prolific National League goalscorer but had a lean year averaging only one goal every five goals.

Candidates for League honours at the halfway mark, Stop Out eventually finished fourth but still became the first Wellington club to earn a share of the Rothmans prize money. They had themselves to blame for losing touch with the leaders as they dropped too many points to interior teams; nevertheless it was easily the club's best performance in the National League and augers well for 1975.

Both the defence and the attack were strengthened by new signings, but the midfield remained the problem area and someone is needed who can hold the ball and set up play. Willie Straw, the Manawatu youngster who was a professional with Doncaster Rovers before coming to New Zealand, had some success as the midfield pivot but was obliged to return to Manawatu United to fulfill contractual obligations and Stop Out's results fell away thereafter. Warren Hosnell was brought in to replace Straw but being of lighter build he was more easily dispossessed and might have been to use the solid veteran Allan Jeffrey who spent most of the season on the bench, especially as Ron McFadyen on the left was of similar build to Hosnell.

Keith Barton, the pick of the midfield, had the work rate and drive but is not a playmaker and perhaps this explains why Stop Out persisted with the tactics of either Gary Paddison or Steve Boyland. This paid off at first and by the end of May, Paddison had eight goals but as the opposition came to realise the danger and paid more attention to close marking. Paddison looked less and less like scoring and in the remaining ten games he added only one more goal to his tally.

The real menace in the Stop Out attack came from the wings where Steve Boyland and Garry Welch shared a common willingness to beat an opponent and had the speed and acceleration to accomplish the feat. Welch, an off season signing from Central League club Seatoun, proved to be one of the finds of the National League and is the type of player to attract the crowds. Boyland's exceptional skill is well known and his best is still to be seen but at the moment he is in danger of becoming just a runner.

The defence began with a happy combination of youth and experience, Glen and Tom Winter supplying the speed and mobility and captain Mike Jones and player-coach Maurice Tillotson the know how and reading of the game but when injury put Glen Winter out of the side and Ken Dugdale came in as Jones' partner the balance altered and the general impression of both defence and midfield was a lack of speed.

Signing Maurice Tillotson as player-coach proved a wise move as he had the confidence of his players and got the best from them. Unfortunately, his own game suffered and though his positioning and covering remained first class, his talent for overlapping was rarely used. George Flecknor in the goal was generally sound even though his distribution lacked imagination.

At least Wellington City are consistent if nothing else; since the start of the National League their placings have been 7th, 9th, 7th, 8th and 7th. No team played worse football during the year than City did at home to North Shore and on the strength of that game and other Basin Reserve performances it would have been a blessing had they, and not Wellington Diamond United, been relegated yet on other occasions City showed a degree of competence well worthy of National League status.

Individualism was the root of City's problems and not all the players were willing to knuckle down to the pattern of play that coach Jim Batson wanted to follow. This led to transfer requests and it was obvious that even those remaining had doubts about the efficacy of the system. Regardless of the merits or demerits, all would have been well had the players given 100% effort but unfortunately this did not happen. Yet when City were really struggling with a makeshift team they came up with some of their best efforts and here the contributions from Alan McLeod and Paul Buckle were invaluable.

City scored more goals than ever before, due to the efforts of Jim Richardson who scored half the total City tally. His speed off the mark frequently caught the opposition napping although he was less of a threat to the well organised defence. Richardson did not score a goal until the fifth game and in the meantime Peter Brown, a recent arrival from Scotland, had been doing all the scoring. Oddly, Brown never scored again while Richardson went on to net 16 and be the National League's top scorer for the season.

The reliable Jim Coutts and the former Caversham player Maurice Batey were, along with Brown, the only ever-present players. The tall centre-back Paul Cameron was again troubled with injury and missed nearly all the second-round matches. Injury also kept Alan Smith on the sideline in the same period. Dennis Mack, a Chatham Cup medalist with North Shore in 1967, made his National League debut with City after some so so displays by David Gollan but City could have done with Peter Whiting.

Free accommodation, full pay, match bonuses and return air fares lured the likely lads, Eric Lesbirel and Bernie Pool, to Hong Kong at the close of the 1973 season here in New Zealand and although both stated their intention of returning for the next National League campaign only Lesbirel did so. Thus Diamond lost not only their best player but also one who appreciated the true role of a link man. Much was written during the past season about the forwards' inability to put the ball in the net but the truth is that Diamond created very few good scoring chances, the reason being almost total lack of support for the ball carrier. Whereas Poole passed the ball, then immediately moved to where he could take a return pass or help out if the move broke down, this kind of support was missing in 1974 and attacks were mounted in such a predictable manner that the opposition had little trouble in countering them. Henry Nauta's aggressive running offered almost the sole variety but unfortunately his control did not match his speed.

Diamond's other big problem was finding a successor to Ian Johnston as team coach. Eventually Bill Dumbell, who coached Christchurch Technical in 1973, had an English F.A. coaching badge and had previously coached Southern League clubs in England as well as being national coach of Libya for a time, was signed three weeks before the first league game. After seeing his new club lose to Mt Wellington and Stop Out in consecutive games, Dumbell made sweeping changes, bring in four ex-Technical players for the third league game, a home match with Christchurch United, which again resulted in a loss. By the halfway stage 22 players had been tried and Diamond had just the two championship points gained from a disputed penalty kick in the New Brighton match. To boost morale Diamond flew out 25-year-old Lou Adams, a leading goalscorer in the English Southern League football, with Barnet, Bedford Town and Stevenage clubs, and although he did not score heavily, his presence lifted some of the weight off the disheartened strikers and with a more settled team overall Diamond at least gave their supporters something to cheer about. High spots were the 1-1 draw with Mt Wellington, the record breaking eight goal defeat of Eastern Suburbs and the extended Lion Chatham Cup run culminating in the club's first ever appearance in the final. However, it would be true to say that as team coach Bill Dumbell never came to grips with the real problem and by blaming bad luck and criticizing other teams unjustifiably he virtually talked his own club into replacing him and Sam Malcolmson took control for the promotion-relegation series.

Given the inadequacies Diamond still played a lot of good football. After a hesitant start Steve Pateman blossomed into the most specular but nevertheless efficient goalkeeper in the league and was one Dumbell protégé to make good. Malcolmson, as captain and mainstay of the defence, never had a bad game and was generally well supported by Martyn Love and Duncan Hill, Harry Carrington who looked the best of the halfbacks, took over the left back position late in the season when David Strom tossed the game away. In yet another puzzling positional change Ken Millar, the most likely goalscorer in the side, was pulled back to midfield. Adams showed that given the right support he could be a prolific goalscorer although he managed only four league and two cup goals.

Central One

In winning the League championship by six clear points, Porirua United established a new 1st Division record. Had they not made such hard work of the last seven games, from which only seven points were taken, the record would have taken a true hammering. Make no mistake, Porirua were good but it was their misfortune to strike an outstanding team in Caversham in the Rothmans National League play-off series. It now remains to be seen whether they can benefit from the experience and make an even bolder challenge in 1975. Youth is on their side and few clubs have such a happy combination of speed and strength. Bruce Baker returned to the club to advance his goalscoring record in Central and National League games to 52 and Porirua also welcomed Wayne Huntley and John Conner from Waterside. Another newcomer, Brian Barnish from England made a big difference in midfield with his intelligent running off the ball and young Jeff Thompson showed a lot of potential as a winger. The defence was again well led by Steve Edwards with good support from Martin Jordan and goalkeeper Steve Brady, who gained national recognition by his selection for the national Under 19 team to Tahiti.

With three seconds and a third placing in the four years of 1st Division football, Nelson United are undoubtedly consistent. Lack of goalscorer was the let down this time as the goal tally was down on previous years whereas the defence was tighter following the acquisition of goalkeeper Colin Howie from Naenae. The departure of John Hannah early in the season was a serious blow as he had been a regular goalscorer and when his friend Tom McKenzie followed soon afterwards prospects looked decidedly poor. However, the introduction of younger local players proved somewhat successful although there was a marked decline in performance. Perhaps the brightest hope for the future is David Brydon who moved from defence, where he gained New Zealand Under 21 honours in 1973, to attack with conspicuous success. Injuries and sickness affected the team to a degree and Willie Carr and Lew Higgison, two of the club's best young prospects missed the entire campaign while Steve Shaw was prevented through sickness from playing over the latter part of the season. Having lost his job with New Brighton, Bruce Macdonald accepted the challenge of developing a Manawatu United team capable of achieving National League status. To this end he had first call on all the players in the district no matter what their club affiliation, although the emphasis, naturally, was on players who still had a career ahead of them. Initially results were not too encouraging but after Joe Habets and Willie Straw joined the team an improvement was noticeable. With 12 goals to his credit at the halfway mark Hank van Heeckeren looked set to smash Paddy Breslin's club record of 17 goals in a season but the midas touch left the young Dutchman and no-one else could help out. Nevertheless, his final total of 14 was the highest for the division. Fortunately, the defence gave few problems and in George Dunning Manawatu had one of the best custodians in the League. He also showed his ability as a penalty taker by netting against Waterside in the Cup and Upper Hutt in the league. Rob Toland and Lyall Hastie also gave good service. Coach Macdonald turned in some useful displays on the wing when all else failed.

A placing as high as fourth flattered Miramar Rangers and re-appraisal of policy must be overdue. For four years now Rangers have provided virtually all the backing for Wellington City but apart from 1971 when Jack Nathu, Paul Cameron and Steve Bruce made the team not one junior has come through the ranks to gain a regular place in City's National League team. Worse still the juniors aren't even coming forward to challenge for places in Rangers' Central League team and the flag has been carried by the likes of David Farrington, Ian Marshall, Robbie Bryant and Phil Peters who have never made the jump to higher levels and are not likely to now. However, Rangers always provide solid opposition and other clubs could well do with some of their spirit.

Anything but first place counts as failure for Waterside and to finish as low as fifth demands strike action, but look at the players they lost – Brian Simmonds, Derek Ralph, Jeff Adams, Jim Gutteridge, Wayne Huntley, Tony Loomes who between had scored over 50 goals in 1973. Gone to were fullback John Conner and coach Imre Kiss. Mike McDonald, who replaced Kiss as coach, had a very difficult task in reconstructing a 1st division side but for quite some time Waterside kept up near the top and had they been able to prove their domination of play by scoring the goals that count they could well have been second. Martin Ryan stood out for effort and football sense and it is a pity that study prevents him playing National League football. Roger Blake, David Boardman, John Higgins and Andy Provan were sound if not spectacular defenders. Hope for the future may well lie in the very promising juniors now starting to come through from the Waterside affiliated club Porirua City. Brian Field certainly made tremendous improvement over the year and Daniel Cooper looked a likely prospect once he matures physically.

Upper Hutt United also had a start from scratch with a new coach and new team and had the further misfortune to lose their constructive halfback Arthur Inglis with a broken leg when there remained three games to play. It is quite remarkable really that of the 14 players who played five or more games in 1973 only one, Graeme Wilson, was available throughout 1974. There were useful performances from most of the newcomers with Ron Little, Tony Gorman and Ron Roberts being the most impressive. Brian Davidson, a prolific scorer in the past seasons, tried out with Wellington Diamond United at the start of the year but returned in time for the fifth League game, unfortunately he did not bring his shooting boots with him.

Seatoun, the last of the ten teams to get off the mark with a championship point, stayed perilously close to relegation all season and only an unbeaten run of seven games, from July onwards, pulled them clear. 1974 represented a change in policy for the club with the acquisition, after years of encouraging local talent, of two overseas players Jim Stokes and Gary Singleton. Stokes came to the club on the recommendation of Terry Conley and although generally sound did not stand out. Otherwise Seatoun relied on local products who were capable of playing quite good football, that is until they came anywhere goal when they lost it all.

Kiwi United paid the penalty for its support of Manawatu United, to whom it provided Willie Straw, Joe Habets, Tom Scott, Lyall Hastie and George Dunning. However, with Paddy Breslin making regular appearances as a substitute and popping in goals at appropriate times Kiwi gathered sufficient points to stay clear of the bottom two places. Sam Webster tried hard to help his youthful teammates who, as a team, didn't really appear to be ready for this class of football.

After winning their first name Naenae Old Boys had to wait until the 13th round to repeat the performance and by the time relegation was a very real prospect. With Wayne Torrie back in the team after an overseas jaunt eight points were gathered from the last five games but as it turned out this was not enough for with Wellington Diamond United being relegated from the Rothmans National League, two teams had to drop out of the Central League 1st Division. In John Hall Naenae had one of the best footballers in the league and some of his goals had class written all over them.

Right through the season Moturoa United were in the last three and though they improved over the closing stage, Seatoun and Naenae, who were with them at the bottom, did even better so Moturoa must now play in the 2nd Division again after one brief spell in the top grade. The real cause of their troubles was inexperienced reserves for when injury and departures weakened the team, young second team members had to be thrown in at the deep end and this highlighted hitherto undisclosed weaknesses. Players like Ray Powell and Peter Wisniewski looked less assured when put in position of leadership and but for some courageous goalkeeping by George Yearbury, for which he was rewarded with New Zealand Under 21 and Under 19 selection. Moturoa's record would have been a lot worse. Robert Paul and Peter Ritchie were generally good value and gave the attack some bite. Peter Eliadis, hampered by Injury, was a mere shadow of his old self.

Central Two

Hungaria had a fairly comfortable passage through the grade once Eddie Wilson and Bob Minshull gave away National League to sign for the club. Their presence in the defence along with Ken Whaley who made a mid-season comeback took the pressure off the halves and some classic football was seen from the likes of Imre Kiss, Istvan Nemet and the maestro himself Lotsy Polyanszky. The contribution of younger players such as Richard Strom (a brother of WDU's David and Jeff), Andy West and Jeff Adams was also significant. The big question now is do Hungaria have the stamina to foot it with a team like Porirua.

A well disciplined Lower Hutt City side kept tight control on opposing forward lines but in doing so restricted its own scoring chances and then failed to capitalise on those that were offered with the result that nine matches were drawn. Perhaps there was too rigid adherence to a 4-3-3 formation, maybe more effective use could have been made of Jim Ferrier as the main striker – these are no doubt aspects to which coach Kevin Baker will be giving deep thought in the off season for Lower Hutt must score goals to realise its ambition of 1st Division status, something the club last held in 1966 when playing under the Railways label.

The first fruits of the policy of fielding one strong club to represent the Wairarapa district were reaped when Masterton won the \$75 prize money for a third place in Division Two. A good beginning, 10 points from a possible 14, saw Masterton sharing the lead after the seventh series of matches but as the grounds became wetter and heavier this young, fast side found it hard to play the type of football for which it had been coached and performance fell away. John Mutimer was the outstanding player in the team and his 17 goals, particularly those he scored from the midfield in the first half of the season, inspired his colleagues.

No team disappointed more than Napier City Rovers. In most matches they dominated play but could not put the ball into the net. This frustration inevitably led to mistakes by the Napier defenders and these proved very costly. After much experimenting Graeme Hill, who had played on the left wing, was moved to centre-forward and this did bring an improvement up front. Jim Nelson, who started the season with Gisborne City, returned home to play in all but one of Napier's league games and his presence lifted the midfield standard. Goalkeeper Bill Sweeney and centre-half Roy Stanger also stood out as did evergreen fullback Terry O'Neill who has not missed a game for six seasons and now has 125 league appearances to his credit.

Although Wainuiomata's results also fell short of expectations they played some very good football and on the basis of goals scored would have been runners-up to Hungaria. Their spirited display against WDU in the Lion Chatham Cup was especially appreciated by the hardy Basin Reserve regulars and it was an injustice to lose by four goals. Chatham Cup commitments and postponements because of ground conditions had much to do with Wainuiomata's league placing for at the end of the season, when postponed games against the top three teams had to be played, no fewer than four players were on the injured list. Frank Burkhard, the team captain, led by example from the left back position but he is returning to England and will not be available for 1975. Graham Watson toiled unceasingly in midfield and there were encouraging displays by the youngsters Alistair Cochrane as goalkeeper and Glen Drew as striker.

To follow a youth policy through to a successful climax takes courage and while not pushing the panic button Petone did make calls on some of their stalwarts to ease the pressure.

Selection clamps were also placed on coach Grant Williams who gave the job away when the restrictions became intolerable. Certainly Petone had a swag of good youngsters; Eddie Phelan and Gary Stephenson went to Australia with the New Zealand under 16s, Grant Turner made the North Island Under 16 team but generally speaking these youngsters, and there seven under 18 years of age, weren't ready, physically for the hurly-burly of 2nd Division football.

Brought together only three weeks before the season began and without a coach until the week preceding the first game Wanganui fought off the threat of relegation with a spirited second round rally which produced 11 points. Out of a squad of 15 regular players, nine were under 20 years of age including the two schoolboys Ted Hulbert and Grant Benson and every player bar one was a product of local junior football. The defence conceded less goals than all but the top two teams with Alf Morley in goal turning in some great displays. And although the forwards didn't really get amongst the goals Doug Jones at least managed 11 to bring his league total to 77.

Despite cutting back on goals against (77 in 1973, 47 in 1974) Christian Youth F.C. again had the worst defensive record in the 2nd Division and although they dodged relegation initially they were demoted later when Wellington Diamond United dropped down from National to Central League football. Not all the blame for this can be loaded onto the defence, indeed had it not been for the good work of Nigel Metcalf and Wally Allen in particular, CYFC would have been in a lot more strife. No, the breakdowns occurred elsewhere and as a result the defenders became involved in unequal one versus two challenges. Individually the players did quite well but failed as a unit once possession was lost.

Brooklyn Northern United the club in the longest continuous membership of the 2nd Division and the only foundation member to have stayed in that division since the League began in 1968, will compete in the 3rd Division in 1975 as a result of the introduction of automatic relegation for the bottom two 2nd Division 2nd Division clubs. Losing 1973 coach Michael McDonald and four prominent players to Waterside coupled with the absence of Brian Middleton and Ian Smith meant that the new mentor, Bob Wallace, had to start pretty well from scratch. He came up with a more than useful player in Jim Cromie, a hard as nails type who was a model of consistency and scored seven valuable goals. Wallace himself netted eight and Alan Flitcroft also did well but overall team effort was less than adequate giving the impression that United, after nearly a decade of indifferent results, had resigned itself to losing.

Mark Rod Grant and you play New Plymouth City out of the game became the pre-match message of rival coaches and they were right more often than not. It was a pity to see City do so poorly for Old Boys, who provided most of the City players, had unsuccessfully tried to interest Moturoa United in an amalgamation. When talks between the two broke down Old Boys entered into an arrangement with Central City to form a combined side for Central League play but without some of the more seasoned Old Boys' players the combined side struggled from the outset and continual shuffling of players did nothing to improve matters.

Eight minutes later Bannister scored the first of his two goals when T Stanton fired a good shot from well out which was partially saved by Flecknor, Bannister needed only half a chance to hammer the ball home.

The third goal came a similar move when Stanton placed a good cross kick for the flying Bannister who pushed the ball into the net.

Changes made to the Wellington defensive line at halftime proved to be effective because the visitors could not break through again. But with the absence of goals the match deteriorated into a scrappy affair and it was not until one minute from full-time when K Stephens volleyed the ball 30 yards into the net that there was something for the crowd to enthuse over.

1974 MATCH REPORT - FINAL

Christchurch United's 32-year-old linkman B. Hardman will remember a moment of explosive joy, at nine minutes past four on Saturday, September 7 1974, at Queen Elizabeth II Park, for the rest of his life. And so, will his team-mates and his club's supporters.

It was then that Hardman scored United's second goal and sealed a Christchurch victory over Wellington Diamond United in the 1974 Lion Chatham Cup final. He took the final defence-splitting pass, from his midfield colleague, T. Randles, took two steps to position himself, and then drove the ball low and powerfully into the corner of the net.

Hardman leapt in the air and raced upfield, his left arm held high as the token of success, and was swallowed up in the congratulations of his team-mates. It was the signal, too, for United supporters to burst into song - "We are the champions." It started out, perhaps, as a sigh of relief, before becoming a full-throated roar of conviction.

That told one story. The other was enacted by a Wellington Diamond United supporter. He had wrapped his scarf around the Chatham Cup before the match had started. Now he stepped forward and retrieved it.

Thus were success and failure dramatically celebrated by the victors and the vanquished at this moment of truth. In the three minutes of play that remained both teams simply went through the motions of officially finishing a match that had already ended.

The presentation of the Lion Chatham Cup by the president of the New Zealand Football Association (Mr T. W. McGuigan) to the captain of the United side (K. France), the speeches, the receptions, the toasts and the dancing into the early hours of yesterday morning were the fruits tasted in full by the winners. The W.D.U. players and supporters, returned to Wellington early in the evening "to drown our sorrows," as one of their party said.

It was not a classic final. The ground, although not a lake the rain had threatened to make it earlier in the week and before the mopping-up operation went into action, was wet enough to dampen much of the players' skills.

It demanded the teams should put safety first. For those who see soccer mostly as a build-up from man to man, not a long punt and hell-for-leather chase, it was a cruel decision.

United, although it adapted itself better to the conditions, was not an entirely happy team on the day. It was expected to dominate in the mid-field and it did not. It kept on trying to play football where the foot and the ball found themselves on unequal terms with the ground conditions.

The match was largely won for United by the power of its defence and the determination of its strikers. Outstanding on the day were S. Sumner and K. Doornenbal up front, R. Drinkwater and L. Blyth at the back. and W. Arney in the middle. This was not to under-estimate the parts played by the others.

I. Park scored the first goal, Hardman got the second, Randles had a foot in both. France and G. Griffiths helped solidify the defence and deny W.D.U. more than three or four scoring chances, and W. Weir, in goal, atoned for one bad mistake with two splendid takes.

But it was Sumner and Doornenbal who epitomised the United victory. Sumner was a doubtful starter up to an hour before the kick off – perhaps in the anxious mind of the United coach, Terry Conley, until the first time he stretched his injured ankle into an attacking run.

But if there were any doubts at all in Sumner's mind he squashed them in a most courageous display of front-running. At times the finger has been pointed at Sumner because he allows himself to drift out of a game. This final will be remembered as 90 minutes reply to his critics.

Doornenbal too, gave his all unsparingly and unselfishly. His studs made their mark on every patch of turf. At the finish he looked like a player who had been dragged by a runaway horse.

The heroes for Diamond were its goalkeeper, S. Pateman who made two incredible saves – even impossible saves – and the linkman, E. Lesbirel.

He needed to concentrate so much on keeping the ball under control as he splashed through the water that he had little time to make the move which would have caught the United defenders out of position.

So, if it was not a classic final. It was a tense one. And the tension was built upon the long gap between United's first goal in the nineteenth minute and the second in the eighty-seventh. Between them there was always the possibility of W.D.U. snatching an equaliser and setting the game alight. It did not do so, did not deserve to, but did go close twice.

After the first 15 minutes, while United put its defensive house in order, Christchurch largely controlled the first half. A header by L. Adams that went yards too high was the initial thrust, but it was quickly followed by United's opening goal.

Doornenbal started it with a run down the right. He passed to Sumner, moved into an open space and took the return pass. Doornenbal then beat his marker, got to the line and crossed low. Park was on his own, with time to bring the ball under control, steady himself and hammer it past Pateman.

Doornenbal made another run of the same vintage soon afterwards: but this time he finished it himself but shot wide. Lesbirel had W.D.U.'s best chance of the first half when the ball came out to him from a corner kick, but his left-footed volley went a long way wide.

United put in a fierce barrage over the last 10 minutes of the half and Pateman was a little lucky to survive. He flung out a hopeful hand to a header by Doornenbal and contacted with just enough strength to deflect the ball past a post. And then he happened to be standing on the way of a superbly taken flick by Sumner and found the ball stuck to his chest.

There were two sides to United's play in the second half – positive periods as bookends to a drab chapter. But WDU just did not have the resources to take advantage of the very few chances that came its way.

The one moment of sheer panic for United came in the sixty-second minute after Weir came out to a ball and lost it. United players seemed to pop up out of the ground as they converged like a flock of shoppers on a choice bargain at a sale to deny WDU a clear slight of an empty goal. Somehow the ball was cleared and with it went Diamond's last chance.

At the end of the half Pateman was peppered with shots. He was not at full stretch to save most of them for they went straight to his ready hands. The one that beat him came from a brilliant movement.

Sumner was in at its inception, his strong determined running setting up the chopping block. Randles, then, raised the axe with his pass that put Hardman into the clear, and Hardman completed the execution with one swift, lethal blow.

And that was really the end of the forty-eighth Chatham Cup final.

Annual Report Notes Extract

Introduction - Your Executive Committee presents the 84th Annual Report for the Wellington Football Association Inc.

Summary - This season must go down in the annals of football history as being one, if not the wettest seasons on record and the misery of the wet, cold days at the Basin Reserve can perhaps be only surpassed by the predominantly drab and uninteresting quality of the soccer presented to the public. The Association must sympathise with the lower divisions for the number of cancellations suffered by them but it was indeed positive attitude by most clubs to the situation and their realisation that the circumstances were beyond our control.

Representative Team - This year we have played two games, the first against Bristol Rovers in May and the second against the NZFA Rothmans Under 21 team in its internal tour of the lower half of New Zealand. Unfortunately we lost both games.

National League - Congratulations to Stop Out in finishing in the highest position ever for a Wellington team in this competition. At the moment we have to learn the outcome of the National League Play Off series involving W.D.U. and Porirua United Clubs for a position in the League for 1975.

Central League - Porirua United won the First Division Championship. Hungaria AFC won the Second Division Championship. Stop Out AFC won the Qualifying Division, but will not necessarily be promoted. This means that third place North Wellington may be promoted instead.

Junior National Cup - This year Rongotai College won its way to the National Semi-Final held in Christchurch and unfortunately lost to Christchurch United.

Womens Football - The sub-Association comprised of eleven affiliated Clubs. 15 teams were entered in the League Competition, 8 in the First Division and 7 in the Second Division. Upper Hutt ended the season clear winners of the 1st Division and the Royle Oak Cup and Miramar Rangers clear winners of the 2nd Division and the Promotion Cup. The standard of play during the League Competitions proved to be a marked improvement on 1973. After keen competition in the preliminary rounds to the Cup Final, Palmerston North Saints beat Upper Hutt in an exciting Cup Final fixture, thereby winning the Kelly Cup for the first time. In an equally exciting match at the end of the season provincial fixture, Wellington beat Auckland 3-0 thereby retaining the Roy Cox Shield played annually between the two centres. Through the initiative of the Wellington Football Association, attempts have been made to form a New Zealand Women's Football Association in conjunction with the Auckland and Christchurch Women's Associations.
